

VADA KATHRYN NORMAN SALLAS

Mrs. Vada Kathryn Norman Sallas, age 87, widow of the late J. B. Sallas, passed away in Crockett, Texas on Tuesday, August 28, 2007. Mrs. Sallas was born in Killeen, Texas on July 13, 1920 and married J. B. Sallas in Athens, Texas December 22, 1941.

They met in Austin, Texas where she was in business school and he was in the University of Texas Law School. Upon moving to Crockett, she worked right along with her husband in his law practice. He served 8 years in the Texas Legislative and she worked in the General Land Office where she made many friends and had the nickname "Polly."

Mrs. Sallas moved to Crockett in 1949 where she was active and participated in many Crockett affairs. Mrs. Sallas was a member of the First Baptist Church and worked in the Primary Department with Wilson Norris and Maggie Kent and was also secretary of several departments.

Mrs. Sallas supported the

Family Life Center and other interests of the church. Mrs. Sallas was a charter member of the Davy Crockett Pilot Club, member of the Phythian Sisters, member of the Magnolia and Garden Club, director of the Glenwood Cemetery Association and Evergreen Cemetery Association.

Mr. and Mrs. Sallas were instrumental in making and giving a place for baseball fields near the Civic Center for Little League Baseball as she and her husband enjoyed baseball and were fortunate to hold season tickets to the Houston Astros for 25 years so that they and their friends could enjoy the games.

Survivors include her brother James Bert Norman and wife Sue, of Harker Heights; sister Anna Dea Davidson, of Huntsville; many nieces and nephews.

Preceded in death by her husband J. B. Sallas on September 24, 1995; parents John and Isa Hoover Norman; brothers Hoover, J. Fred, Jack and Harris Norman; and sister Mary Elizabeth Prestridge.
