

C.W. KENNEDY, JR.

Mr. C.W. Kennedy, Jr. of 921 East Houston Avenue, Crockett, died Sunday, April 13 in a Houston hospital.

He was born in Augusta, and had resided in Crockett for the past 45 years. He attended the Virginia Military Institute and the University of Texas. He was licensed to practice law before the United States Supreme Court and he was a past director of the State Bar of Texas. He practiced law with his partner the late Frank Granberry in Crockett except during World War II when both partners were in service.

He was past president of the Crockett and Grapeland Lions Clubs; a member and Past Worshipful Master of the Grapeland Masonic Lodge; a member of the Scottish Rite Bodies and a 32nd degree Mason; past president and chairman of the board of the Grapeland State Bank; a member of and past Steward of the First United Methodist Church of Crockett. He served in com-

munity activities in both Crockett and Grapeland.
