It was fondly hoped that she might be revived, but the pressure had been too great, and she gradually and continually sank, until in a few hours she closed her eyes upon the sad scenes of earth. Mrs. Stewart was one of the purest and kindest of earth, and was gathered as a ripe shock into the garner on high.
